Mission Trip, Anyone?

Each year—usually at shoebox packing time—there are always a few people who voice an interest in a mission trip to an Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Processing Center. The Charlotte, North Carolina center is the largest and is within a day's drive for us to reach. Members of our congregation have helped at this center in the past and found it to be an enjoyable and rewarding experience.

The atmosphere is festive with Christmas music playing and people laughing as they make new friends and work together. The packing season begins the week before Thanksgiving and continues until December 15, 2018.

If you are interested, don't be concerned about "not knowing what to do" when you arrive. Each volunteer group receives an orientation with hands-on training to teach what one

needs to know. Each day, the volunteer group is assigned to a particular task. These tasks may include checking boxes for contraband, filling partially full boxes, packing completed boxes into shipping containers, or reading barcodes with scanners prior to shipping.

In the past, we have stayed in a comfortable motel near the center, one that includes breakfast. We decide in advance how many 4 hour shifts we would like to work while in Charlotte, as well as, what dates are best for our group.

If you have an interest in this potential mission trip, please do not hesitate to let Sandy Noland or Kenita Keck know of your interest or any questions you may have. We need to have a tentative headcount to register our group beginning the first week of October.

OCC Collections – The Operation Christmas Child Packing Party will be here before you know it. Right now is the best time to begin preparing by looking for some of the items we will need to put into our 300 shoeboxes. Sadly, it is back to school time.

So be on the lookout for sales on supplies like: crayons, pencils, paper, notebooks, coloring books, pens, erasers, and pencil sharpeners. There will be a box in the sanctuary for collecting all the supplies.

A Helping Hand – Everyday the church gets calls from individuals who need help. A few times a week people come to our door asking for help. Help with bills, help with gas, help with transportation... The world is full of needs. We do our best to point individuals to the places and organizations that can help them immediately and in the long term.

But, we should be able to offer some help ourselves. What do we do when a homeless person, a mother, a child, a drug addict comes to our door with need?

With that in mind we would love to be able to hand them food, clothing, short term transportation help. Imagine if we could hand them a box of food, a bag of clothes, something warm in the winter, a few Licking County Transit tokens, the Scripture and help directing them to places that can continue getting them the help we need.

We have the food covered. The Food Pantry Network has donated boxes of food designed for the homeless and needy. It contains enough food for a weekend, including fruits and vegetables.

Would you be able to go through your closets and donate your unused clothing so that we can put together grocery bags that work for men and women of all sizes and ages?

People are always in need of underwear, bras and socks. These items usually do not make it to the thrift stores. We would love to be able to pass out these items as well (new please). I suggest sports bras so they do not have to be perfect fits.

Folks are often asking us for toiletries. Maybe you could donate a bag with some soap, shampoo, deodorant, feminine hygiene items, and toothpaste. We have lots of tooth brushes.

This way we could grab a box of food, a bag of clothing that fits them, the Word of God, some items to help them cleanup and a few tokens that will help them get around for a few days.

Look for a donation box in the sanctuary.
