



January 9th will be un-decorating the church following the worship service. A light lunch will be served.




Good Morning Bible Study, held on Thursday mornings in the Fellowship Hall from

10:00am noon is done for the winter but will resume the first Thursday in March, weather permitting. Plan on joining us in the Spring.




ARE YOU INTERESTED IN ENCOUNTERING GOD?

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Update – This Will Make Your Heart Happy!



Despite a global pandemic, 1.9 million shoeboxes were collected and distributed to more children in more than 170 countries and

territories worldwide. Each gift-filled shoebox—packed with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—is a tangible expression of God’s love, and it is often the first gift these children have ever received.

100 of those shoeboxes were sent by our First Presbyterian Church family. Some of our boxes were tracked and we have just recently learned of some of their final destinations—Botswana, Madagascar, Jamaica, Tanzania, and Mali! Children in those countries are playing with Barbie dolls you sent, wearing their new dresses and hats, playing soccer with the first ball ever in their village, and enthusiastically coloring with pencils, markers, and crayons of every color.

Most importantly, many of these children have chosen to take part in a 12-lesson discipleship program, “The Greatest Journey,” a course designed for Operation Christmas Child shoebox recipients. Children who participate in the program learn how to follow Christ and share Him with others. As they do, entire families and communities are transformed by the power of the Gospel, and churches are started. More than 26.5 million children have enrolled in The Greatest Journey since 2009.

What a fun, easy, and inspiring (not to mention, comfortable!) way to be a missionary! Together, we are rallying around the opportunity and calling to serve Jesus in this way—with urgency to introduce more and more children to a loving God through His son Jesus Christ.” - Kenita

Pastor Search Update:

There have been some requests made for status on pastor search process to the session. One of the first things we need to have happen is to select a pastor to fill the role of an interim and help guide us through the process of selection of the PNC committee and initiate the mission study and self-evaluation process of the congregation desires and community needs. Currently there are 15 congregations in our Presbytery in the process of searching for interim or full time pastors. Demand exceeds the available supply. Covid is also slowing down the process and availability of candidates. The session has been discussing a best fit to move forward with this process that will serve our congregation.

I can speak from experience that a family member went through recently in another Presbytery where short cuts were taken with the process to hire a pastor and the selection turned out to be a mismatch. We have great assistance from our Presbytery and will work together to complete the PNC selection and self-studies needed to get our church profile information completed. This is a

timely process and the thing to consider is that this works when allowed to be done in God's time. The session will update you as we move forward but the PNC committee must work in privacy and will not provide updates.
