

The Salvation Army's ministry is well known to the community and includes such things as: Soup Kitchen, Emergency Shelter, Food Pantry, After School programs, Bible studies for youth and adults, Women's ministry, Christmas Cheer program and Worship. Their ministry is located at 250 East Main Street in Newark.

World Vision International is an evangelical Christian humanitarian aid, development and advocacy organization founded in 1950. This partnership of Christians, whose mission is to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, work with the poor and oppressed to promote human transformation, seek justice and bear witness to the good news of the Kingdom of God.



World Vision's approach to aid is to first help people and their communities recognize the resources that lie within them. With the support of World Vision, communities transform themselves by carrying out their own development projects in healthcare, agricultural production, water projects, education, micro enterprise development, advocacy and other community programs.



'Out of disaster, Hope' is the rallying cry of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. It calls us to share our financial blessings to help disaster survivors throughout the world, get involved with disaster recovery ministry and to prayer for God's presence on behalf of disaster survivors. At present, PDA is involved with survivors of hurricanes Harvey, Irene and Maria, California mudslides, Mexican earthquakes, northwestern fires and refugee crises in Syria and Bangladesh.

In this season of Lent, as we remember what Jesus has done for us, may we give a sacrificial gift that God may be pleased. Last year's offering was \$906. #### "40 Acts of Generosity"



As we find ourselves in the middle of Lent and preparations for Easter, we may ponder the act of giving up something. Did you give up anything? I am ashamed to admit, that I did not. "The Spirit is willing, but the

Treasurer Barbara Jobes reported that the 2017 budget was \$185,544.00 and the expenses were \$176,850.33. The treasurer's report included 2017 expenses, the profit/loss statement, specified funds, memorials and line-of-credit usage. In 2017, \$47,082.89 was used from the line-of-credit.

Heating was over budget due to the need for a new boiler; however, the new boiler is helping with that expense. Water costs were up due to a running toilet in the annex. Workers Compensation expenses have never been consistent.

There was a net loss of \$20,287.90 which was borrowed from the line-of-credit and paid back through invested funds. Memorial funds received \$1,970 in 2018. Barbara Jobes has been elected Treasurer by the Session for 2018.

Nominating Committee Chair Louise Whitis thanked the 2017 committee.

The following names were presented into nomination for the Nominating Committee for 2018: Louise Whitis, Chair

A motion was made, seconded and carried to unanimously elect the above slate.

Budget and Finance Committee Chair Keith Hare reviewed the 2017 budget and expenses and discussed the shortfall due to a reduction in income. Half of the new boiler expense of \$37,000 was paid for with designated gifts. An audit was completed for 2016 and 2 months of 2017. The invested funds for 2016 were \$364,949 and was up to \$429,929 on December 31, 2017.

The chair presented the 2018 budget with an expected income of \$197,100. An income line item has been added for fundraising to start at \$15,000, which was previously designated giving. Also the Elks' parking lot 3-year agreement will be renegotiated this year with an expected income of approximately \$6,000. New items on the expense side include advertisement and audit which had previously been included in office supplies, Alpha, and fundraisers start-up funds.

Personnel expenses include: Custodian increase of \$1.00 per hour to \$11.50 per hour for 30 hours per week, secretary salary will remain the same as 2017, organist salary will remain the same at her request, and a slight increase to the choir director so that it can be divided evenly over 26 pays.

Rev. Brand's salary will remain the same for a total package of \$73,153.44 which is slightly over the Presbytery minimum. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the pastor's salary.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the 2018 budget.

Rev. Brand reported for the Property Committee that the first floor was prepared to house and pack the food for the Y Healthy Kids Program. As cost allows, lights are being replaced with LED bulbs.

Worship and Music Chair Kimberly Frick reported that the media system was installed by church members and paid for with donations from the congregation.

In addition, the following written annual reports were reviewed and discussed: Congregational Care Team; Christian Education, Family and Youth; Church Life; Evangelism and Outreach; Alpha and the Choir Director.

At this point the ecclesiastical portion of the meeting was suspended in order to begin the meeting of the corporation.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to elect Rose Gibson as President of the Corporation, as the acting Chair of the Property Committee.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to adjourn the meeting.

The meeting was closed with prayer.

Most all of the current memorial funds will be moved into this new account. All future donations given in memorial will be transferred into this account.

Session approved the use of Scrip money to purchase an update to the Servant Keeper software.

Keith reported two addition items from B&F: \$10,000 from the checking account was applied to the line of credit. B&F authorized Sam Lieb to identify the best funds from the invested funds to use to pay off the line of credit.
