# Note From The Pastor



"Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, "Who do people say I am?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Messiah." –

Mark 8:27-29

Not too long ago, Katelynn was asking my mom a bunch of different questions. One question she asked was: 'did you have any pets as a kid?' I knew the answer to this one, no. My mom had a few animals running around, but they were farm animals, not pets. Yet, sure enough, mom told Katelynn that they had parakeets. They had several; it sounded to me like her family always had a parakeet or two around the house. She even sent me this picture of her as a little girl holding up a bird in a cage. She told me she had a picture somewhere of my Uncle Art riding a horse with a parakeet on his shoulder. I would still like to see that picture.

I know that I had talked to my mom about pets before. I had to have. We had lots of pets and my mom liked animals but never really wanted them to be by her. She did not regularly pet the dog and she never held one of our rabbits. So we would talk about pets and animals and why she was not affectionate with them. We never heard about these parakeets. My brothers did not know anything about them either. I guess there was just something about the situation that made her think about these birds when Katelynn asked that was different than when I had asked in the past.

We learned a lot about mom and dad over the last few months, that we had never known before. If you asked me who my mom was six months ago, you would have gotten a distinctly different answer than I would give today. There is something about new situations, new people, new circumstances, and new stages in life or even a new audience that uncovers new information.

In the Scripture above, Jesus asks the disciples who they think he is and Peter answers, 'You are the Messiah.' I bet that Peter would have answered the same way if asked the same question after Jesus' death and resurrection. He would have answered the same way after the coming of the Holy Spirit, or after years of building the Church, or just before his own death. He certainly would have said that Jesus is the Messiah. Yet, I know what Peter meant by that word (Messiah) would have been drastically different each time he said it. Because, every healing, every teaching, every act of Jesus, every new believer, every life changed, every sinner made whole, every moment of ministry would reveal something new about just what kind of Messiah Jesus is.

It does not matter how long you have been a Christian, there is something new for you to learn about Jesus, something to add to your understanding of what it means that Jesus is your Messiah. This is why we are meant to be in a relationship with Jesus. When we are in a relationship with Jesus we develop a fuller understanding of who he is with every new situation we face together, every life change we face together, every new person we meet together, etc.... The Bible says it is 'living and active' and I think that this is what that means. Jesus is not a lesson learned, or a way of thinking to understand, or a set of rules to memorize, Jesus is a Messiah to live your life with.

We will be observing Communion this Sunday, March 7th, so make sure that you have the necessary elements needed to be able to participate. We



Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 marks the beginning of the season in the church year known as Lent. Lent is a time to prepare for the celebration of Easter and to renew our life in the mystery of the saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ. We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes, a biblical symbol of mourning and penitence. This ancient sign speaks of the fragility of human life, and marks the penitence of the community of faith. I invite you, therefore, in the name of Christ, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of love, and by reading and meditating on the Word of God.

## ADULT ZOOM SUNDAY SCHOOL



The Adult Sunday School class begins our Lenten study March 14<sup>th</sup> using Lee Strobel's "Case for Easter", a 4-week DVD-based study.

In this study Strobel investigates Christ's resurrection to determine whether the resurrection actually occurred. He

explores the 'discrepancies' critics have pointed to in the Gospels, looks at the evidence that Jesus' tomb was truly empty, and shows how the eyewitness accounts of those who saw Jesus alive after the crucifixion are credible. The case for Easter invites us to look beyond the familiar traditions of the season, challenges us to examine the evidence for ourselves, and consider why Easter is so important to our faith.



## **Operation Feed**


Operation Feed of Licking County is a community-wide food drive which coordinates and promotes the collection of food from employees and Licking County residents to feed those in need during times of emergency. The food will be stocked at the Food Pantry Network of Licking County and distributed to member pantries and social service organizations that supply emergency meals for people who are hungry.

In 2020, the Food Pantry Network of Licking County distributed over 5 million pounds of food, our largest quantity in the history of our organization. Approximately 35% of the recipients of food distribution are children and infants who have no control over their situation. With the continued changes in our world today, 2021 will be a year like no other, as we continue to remain social distant. Many residents are working from home or unemployed, and Food Pantry Network is prepared to host a virtual Operation Feed event to ensure we can continue to support our neighbors as they find themselves in difficult situations or in need of food.


