You may have wondered why members of your congregation have been seen carrying mops, brooms, buckets, kitchenware, and even toilet paper to church with them on Sunday morning. No, the items are not for our missions in Slovakia, Haiti, South America or some other far-flung locale (not saying that would be a bad thing.) The ministry that we are partnering with is called Starting Strong. Let me tell you just a bit about it.

Starting Strong is a program of Fostering Further. Fostering Further is an organization whose goal is to create a healthy, supportive relationship between community members and those involved in foster care in central Ohio. Two of its objectives are to encourage emancipating youth and show foster kids they're loved and not forgotten.

Fostering Further has seen 18-year olds age out of foster care



and face struggles like homelessness, pregnancy, and incarceration. That's why Starting Strong was created—to offer resources to young people 18-24 who have emancipated from foster care.

There are thousands of foster children in central Ohio. At age 18, foster children "age-out" of the foster care system - time to leave their foster nest and start out as an adult on their own. Sounds scary, doesn't it? The Starting Strong program helps teenagers launch out on their own successfully. The teens are set up in a safe, well-equipped place to live while the program connects them with community services and to help them get a job, obtain a driver's license, and learn how to live independently.

So, where does First Presbyterian Church fit into all this? Our job is easy but meaningful—we provide the supplies—Apartment Kits—necessary for a young adult to set up housekeeping. How can you worry about a job or a class when you don't have a place to call home? Each spring, there will be a list of



needed items in the rear of the sanctuary. If you're interested, sign up to provide one or more items. It will support and encourage those who are aging out and it will make your heart happy!


On Sunday April 28th we hosted an Apartment Kit packing

PROPERTY REPORT



FPC May Property Report:

- We spent \$620 with DorMar to prepare our boiler/heating system for Columbia Gas of Ohio to come and adjust the gas pressure to keep all of our gas fired equipment working properly. This adjustment by Columbia Gas of Ohio should be finished by the end of April.
- Robert Stokes Roofing Inc., inspected the roof on an actively raining day and found six small nail hold leaks along the metal roof. These leaks will be repaired along with the replacement of the rubber roof and installation of drain cages. This work is to be done in the next month or so at the estimated cost of \$1200. We need a stretch of warm dry weather to complete this work.
- We have had a quiet month as of this report. Praise God!

FINANCE REPORT

Church Account Balances:

As of Tuesday, April 23, 2024, the balance in the church checking account is \$11,541.09. This checking account balance does not yet reflect checks that have been written this week to pay various bills. The largest two checks are:

Per Capita	\$3,240.00
Insurance	\$1,061.22

Including the bills paid this week, our effective checking account balance is \$6,007.03.

The line of credit balance (what we owe) is zero.

The other account balances are:

SCRIP: \$1,274.53

Women's Ministry: \$1,267.84

Savings Account: \$1,500.00

The Savings Account change from last month is because session approved moving \$1,000 from checking to savings to preserve for later use some of the bequest we received in March.
