PCUSA – Witnesses for the Public

The **Reverend Jimmy** Hawkins, Director of Public Witness for the PCUSA in Washington, DC, spoke to a local gathering of Presbyterians Monday, September 16. We learned a little about how Scripture

Y-HEALTHY KIDS BACKPACK PROGRAM

How Can You Take Part?

-Would you like to take part in a program that provides a weekend worth of food, every weekend of the school year, to over 500 kids in our county who would likely go hungry?

-Would you like to take part in a program that is a partnership of churches, the Licking County Food Pantry, the Licking County YMCA, local schools and business leaders?

Here is How:

In School Preparation – On Thursdays, the food gets taken out of the boxes. The bags get put into the kid's backpacks and other items are added. This job takes about 45minutes to complete but most schools have

their teachers doing this. The teachers already do so much. If you would like to help with this final stage, speak with Sally Henry (<u>tomsallyh@windstream.net</u>. She is a member of 2nd Pres and is coordinating this part of the program).

Food Delivery – The Presbyterian Partnership is also tasked with taking these prepacked boxes to the Newark and Heath Schools every other Wednesday. There are seven schools that we will be delivering to. We need people who would be willing to help load the boxes onto a truck and unload the boxes at the schools. Deliveries start in the middle of September. See Rev Steve, or Ron Noland, if you have any questions.

Packing Party – On Saturday, August 24th we had a great time packing up food. We had two lines going at the same time and the team that was there unloaded and loaded 3 pallets full of food which resulted in 630 bags being packed for the upcoming year for Newark City Schools. Great job! And thank you to all that came to help.

We would like to hold a second packing party. This will be coordinated though the church emails. So that we pick a time and date that works for those who wish to participate.



On September 20th Garfield School had teachers and students here to help pack. They came at 4:00pm and stayed until 6:00 and helped get bags of food ready.



Thank you so much Garfield Elementary for your community service. It was very helpful and much appreciated.



Meet Amy Faith

Super Typhoon Haiyan pummeled the Philippines for hours with its relentless 195-mile-per-hour winds and driving rain. Waves nearly 20 feet high crashed over the coastline, leaving nearly 20 feet high crashed over the coastline, leaving 4 million people homeless.

Nine-year-old Amy Faith Raayco, who lives on Bantayan Island, remembers hiding under a bed and clutching her mother, brothers, and sisters when Haiyan hit. Windows shattered, their roof peeled off, and eventually the walls buckled in around them. "I was so scared," Amy said. "All I could do was close my eyes."

Amy and her family lost everything that night. Even the simple Christmas decorations they had were washed away.



Amy's mother and father used their entire life savings to rebuild a one-room house on the old foundation. The children were told not to expect any presents at Christmas. Hope was renewed when Amy was invited to receive an Operation Christmas Child gift box at Bethel Christian Leadership Center. After sending two cargo planes to the Philippines loaded with relief supplies, Samaritan's Purse chartered a third 747 to airlift 65,000 shoebox gifts for children in churches across the devastated islands of Leyte, Bantayan and surrounding communities.

Amy beamed with excitement when she was handed her shoebox. The crayons and scarf she received served as a comforting reminder that God loved her and never forgot her, even after Typhoon Haiyan washed away her home. "I'm so happy to get this shoebox and to use all the things in it." Amy said. "Even this scarf I can use to shade myself since all the trees are gone."


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION
