## Y – HEALTHY KIDS BACKPACK PROGRAM

### How Can You Take Part?

-Would you like to take part in a program that provides a weekend worth of food, every weekend of the school year, to over 500 kids in our county who would likely go hungry?

-Would you like to take part in a program that is a partnership of churches, the Licking County Food Pantry, the Licking County YMCA, local schools and business leaders?

### Here is How:

**In School Preparation** – On Thursdays, the food gets taken out of the boxes. The bags get put into the kid's backpacks and other items are added. This job takes about 45 minutes to complete but most schools have their teachers doing this. The teachers already do so much. If you would like to help with this final stage, speak with Sally Henry [tomsallyh@windstream.net](mailto:tomsallyh@windstream.net) (She is a member of 2nd Pres and is coordinating this part of the program).

**Food Delivery** – The Presbyterian Partnership is also tasked with taking these prepacked boxes to the Newark and Heath Schools every other Wednesday. There are seven schools that we will be delivering to. We need people who would be willing to help load the boxes onto a truck and unload the boxes at the schools. Deliveries start in the middle of September. See Rev Steve, or Ron Noland, if you have any questions.

**Packing Party** – On Saturday, August 24<sup>th</sup> we had a great time packing up food. We had two lines going at the same time and the team that was there unloaded and loaded 3 pallets full of food which resulted in 630 bags being packed for the upcoming

**Items Needed To Fill Boxes:** *Items are Collected Year Round. A Collection Box is Located Outside the Sanctuary Doors on the NW Corner.*

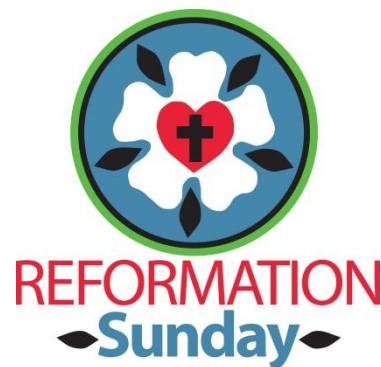
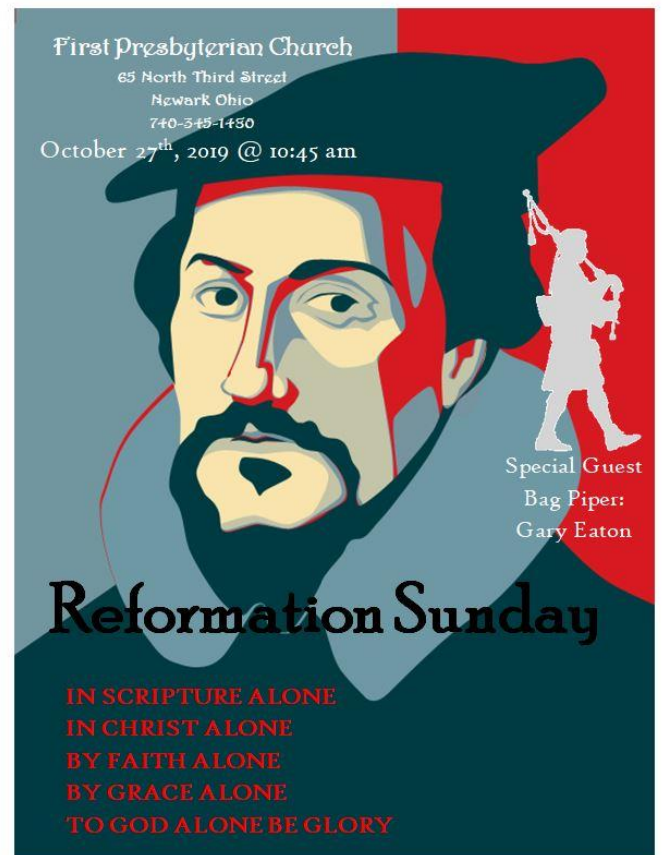

“Calvin argues that the knowledge of God is not inherent in humanity nor can it be discovered by observing this world. The only way to obtain it is to study scripture. Calvin writes, "For anyone to arrive at God the Creator he needs Scripture as his Guide and Teacher." He does not try to prove the authority of scripture but rather describes it as self-authenticating. He defends the Trinitarian view of God and, in a strong polemical stand against the Catholic Church, argues that images of God lead to idolatry.”

On October 27<sup>th</sup> we will celebrate our Scottish Reformed roots with Scottish flair throughout the service including a guest bag piper who will lead us in from out on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street.

### Safe Trick or Treat on the Square



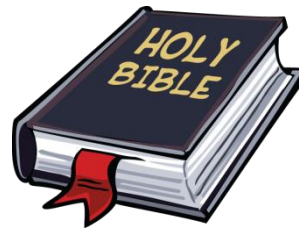

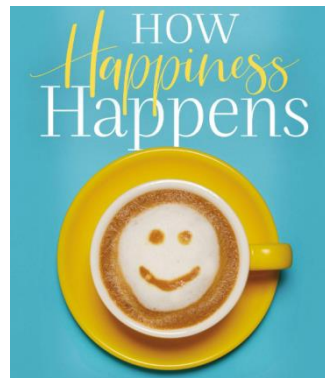

## EVANGELISM & OUTREACH

### Second Mile Giving Missionaries Drs. Mary Lou and Leroy Peters

Drs. Mary Lou and Leroy Peters have been a part of the sacrificial giving to missionaries by this church for about four decades. They are a part of the mission agency Ethos 360, formerly known as New Tribes Mission. Ethos 360 is an international, theological, evangelical mission based in Sanford, Fla. with about 3,300 missionaries in more than twenty countries. The vision of Ethnos 360 is a thriving church for every people group.

Though partially retired, the Peters continue to play a vital role as part of the church planting team by providing training, accounting for and transferring gifts, recruiting missionaries and involving churches and individuals. In their latest communication with us, they told us of their continued good relationship and constant contact with the Cuban churches they have ministered to over many years. They also reminded us that the situation for these churches grows more difficult with the Cuban government.

The Peters also report that they have been blessed in helping to plant another church in the center of Bogota, Columbia. They are working with the pastor of that church, and all is going well with this new church.

Please pray for the Cuban churches and this newly planted church in Columbia. The Peters also ask that we pray for their health.
