Notes: It appears as if the heat is going to be somewhat of an issue over the summer. The 8:30am suggestion might be too early.

Notes: Waiting until July only brings the number of people likely to attend an indoor service up to 16; half the respondents. It is interesting that 1 more person gave the 'Not Likely' response.

Notes: The number one response is policy. Session created a task team that presented a draft policy to session Sunday for review. Even when said policy is in place and communicated, there will be disagreement over whether the policy went too far or not far enough.

The other 4 responses that had at least half the votes are: State Recommendations, New Infection Rates & Availability of Sanitation Supplies. State recommendations need to be studied closely. At this moment, the state is giving guidelines as to how a church can go back to in person sanctuary worship. However, it is recommending that we don't. The state is allowing large weddings and funerals; but recommending that we don't have them. New Infection Rates have been trending down, but there is a serious question as to how much time is needed to indicate actual change. Sanitation Supplies are available. Though you often need to buy whatever option you can and not necessarily the type or brand you would like.

It is possible to have our adult elective class meet as a hybrid of in-person and online. Meaning you would have the option of taking part in the class on Zoom or in-person, in Fellowship Hall. If we did this....

Notes: This hybrid possibility is being investigated. If at all possible, we will do this.

Notes: Clear indications of group desires can be made here. 8 of the 10 questions have over 20 people giving the same response. The majority response to those 8 questions also follow typical recommendations.

It is VERY important that we assume others want us to follow social distancing and other policies; even if you disagree with them. For example: If you want to talk to someone who you haven't seen in a while; assume they want you to be 6 feet away. You can ask them if you can come closer, without pressuring them to do so. If we do not assume that individuals want social distancing, we can make people very uncomfortable and make them less likely to attend church.

The same is true with illness. If you are sick or showing signs of illness, stay home. If one sick person comes to church, it will make many warry of attending service again.

The work of the church requires volunteers. Would you be willing to volunteer for these tasks over the summer?

Notes: The option suggested here, is only an option. Much would need to be done in order to make it possible. No choice would work for everyone. There is also the issue of splitting resources. Any approach that offers multiple opportunities would fit the needs of more of the congregation. It also requires more resources and spreads those resources more thin. Having a drive in service, an online service, and a sanctuary service would give viable opportunities to the bulk of the congregation. More of the congregation would attend a service, but each service would have less people in it. When we put less resources into any given option, we increase the chance that that option will be unsuccessful. Would the drive-in service work if we couldn't find a regular musician for both services? Would the sanctuary service feel like community if it only had ten people?
