Starting Strong is a program of Fostering Further here in Licking County. They provide resources for young people, ages 18-25, who have emancipated from foster care. Some of the resources they provide include:

Hope Landing – Providing transitional housing for young people aging out of foster care.

Welcome Kits – Providing the basics needed for young adults as they move into their first apartments.

Transportation Assistance – Helping youth navigate the process of getting a driver's license.

Independent Living Skills – Teaching youth the basics of living on their own, including finances, health, and job searches.

A NOTE FROM PRESBYTERY

Dear Friends,

I am sure many of you know the history of the church that you attend. While you may not know back more than one hundred years, you may at least know the last four decades or more.

Here is my question to you...in the history of your church, what are the "sacred cows" those are the things that no one can change because they are so set in the history of who the church is that to change them would feel sacrilegious. Go ahead, pause, and figure out what they are. Every church has them. What would happen if that sacred cow were eliminated? What would be at risk? Some of our siblings within the PCUSA, and honestly in many denominations, have recently lost their sacred cows and much more. In the Los Angeles area, multiple Presbyterian Churches have burned to the ground from wildfires. Many within those churches also lost their homes and businesses. What would happen without their sacred cows? Will they be able to pull everything back together? I certainly pray that they do, and I hope that you will join me.
