

EVANGELISM AND OUTREACH MINUTE FOR MISSIONS

An update from Bevan and Laura Stein Ministries:



Through genuine compassion, we're making disciples across multiple ministries, spanning three countries on two continents.

• Ministry to orphans in Slovak staterun orphanages and summer camps:

Taking the gospel to kids in a former communist block country and into the very state-run



orphanages that used to be bastions of atheism off-limits to Christians, is an amazing opportunity and testimony that the gates of hell shall not withstand the

proclamation of the gospel. These kids are too young to remember or even know that for decades there were many kids like them who did not have the opportunity to hear the gospel presented to them. These do however, and have accepted Christ!

• Motorcycle evangelism to unchurched Slovak bikers: When we arrived in 1996

there was no Christian ministry targeting unchurched bikers in Slovakia. I began the first such ministry in 2007. Since



then I have become the unofficial chaplain to up

to 1,100 bikers. They not only come to hear me preach and pray for them individually once a year, they also ask me to be with them in times of grief and joy. I have gained their trust through riding with them and going to all their biker events. I am the only pastor who has ever devoted himself to them and they are responding with open hearts and minds.

- Hippotherapy on our own private Slovak ranch: In 2012 we bought 25 acres to expand our hippotherapy ministry. We have 8 horses which we use to share God's love to kids with emotional or psychological challenges. Many of the kids in orphanages benefit from the peacefulness of our ranch as well as the gentleness of our horses. Some have been healed of trauma and even physical problems that nothing else was able to help. We are so delighted to have our first building built and permits for 4 more buildings so we can offer multi-day retreats.
- Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine: From the



moment the war in Ukraine broke out we began raising funds and taking humanitarian aid. My first load was within 3 days. I got my commercial driver's license to be able to drive a big truck, even though I didn't own one. God provided an 18-ton truck and I became one of only a few who were taking supplies clear to

the front line. Within a short time I was asked to be the national coordinator of humanitarian aid to Ukraine for the Slovak Lutheran Church, a role I still fill today. I have made 27 trips carrying enough food to feed over 4 million people. I was awarded both by the Slovak Ambassador to Ukraine and by the Ukrainian Bible Society as the one who "changes the world." But for me, the best reward is seeing hope return to the eyes of the hopeless. My message to them is simple, "God sees and cares about you."

• Sudanese orphan and widow refugees receive the bread of life: For decades war has raged in Sudan causing mass starvation and death. Millions have fled to Uganda with no shoes and only dressed in rags. Having never been to Uganda did not stop me from asking God what I could do? We started our own organization in northern Uganda called "Heavenly Father's Love Mission, Limited." We have 8 full-time African staff who help us feed, clothe, house and educate 178 refugee orphans and train just as many refugee widows in skills like soap making, basket weaving, hairdressing, sewing, to name a few. But the best thing is that we share God's love with them and lead them to Jesus. They are coming with hearts wide open to the gospel.

• Evangelism and Discipleship in Ugandan Refugee Camps: Once a month, after many have made professions of faith and



been prepared for baptism, the pastors of three churches in the refugee camps take our

new converts to a local river for baptism. This week we baptized 11 and saw 7 more pray to accept Christ. Our Heavenly Father's Love Mission is making a tremendous difference in the lives of many people who were starving to death both physically and spiritually. Today, they march through the refugee camp inviting others to come to Christ and to come to church. And the churches are growing day-by-day in number and in power.
